Scheduled to begin the 2019 Internship program. Please ensure you have your university permit and arrange your school schedule wise.


3-month program: begin on June 24, 2019 end on August 30, 2019



# FOREIGN NATIONAL STUDENT INTERNSHIP PROGRAM (FNSIP)

## SECTIONS' OVERVIEW:

### Information Resources Management/Information Management Office (IRM)/ IMO) Jakarta

About IRM/IMO: responsible for the full range of information management operation of Missions Indonesia and ASEAN

What Interns do in IRM/IMO: the interns will assist day-to-day business in IT management and system administration tasks.

### General Service Office (GSO) Jakarta

About GSO: directs all U.S. Embassy logistic and support functions e.g. procurement, housing and leasing, motor pool, shipping and customs, travel, property management and VIP visitor support.

What Interns do in GSO: Intern will assist and support the daily operation

### Foreign Commercial Service (FCS) Jakarta

FSC is responsible to shall place primary emphasis on the promotion of exports of goods and services from the United States, particularly by small business and medium-sized business and on the protection of U.S. business interest abroad.

What Interns do in FCS: assist the daily business like finding local distributor, single company promotion, administrative tasks.

### Public Affairs Section (PAS) Jakarta

About PAS: further develop partnerships connecting Indonesians and Americans as well as institutional links. Activities include educational advising about studying in the United States, educational and professional exchange opportunities, visiting U.S. experts, cultural events such as film festivals, dance and music performances, English language programs, and almost daily events at our American Cultural Center, @America, and at our information resource center, MyAmerica.

### Pol/Econ Surabaya

About POL/Econ Surabaya: Political section that focuses on U.S. Bi-Mission bilateral relations, Indonesian domestic politics, and social development.

What Interns do in POL/Econ Surabaya: interns will review daily media reports and flag key stories, translate articles, domestic politic research and social developments, attend and report local events.

### Public Affairs Section (PAS) Surabaya

The Public Affairs Section in Surabaya oversees all Public Affairs and Public Diplomacy outreach in a district spanning 12 provinces, promoting all relevant Mission Indonesia programs in this area, whether through cultural programs, social media or outreach with the press.

What Interns do in Surabaya: Would work on photo and video projects highlighting the work of the Consulate in the Surabaya Consular District. During this time videos will be produced for American and Indonesian Independence Day. Would do graphic design work for Consulate events, including events hosted by the Consul General. Would help develop programming related to MyAmerica Surabaya's rebranding as a high-tech 'makerspace', including events utilizing 3D printers, cameras and design equipment. Would develop and lead one youth-focused project (in conjunction with the 2nd intern) at the Consulate. Needs strong English language skills and knowledge of social media platforms like Facebook, Twitter and Instagram, as well as the Adobe suite of software. Existing skill in photography and videography is a must. Press Intern: Strong candidates would be studying journalism or communications. Would work on compiling daily press clips, highlighting relevant issues to Mission Indonesia, and translating Indonesian clips into English. Will work closely with Information Assistant to develop story pitches for local journalists, and other PAS staff to identify stories to highlight on social media. Will draft remarks and press releases, as well as translate information from English to Bahasa for the Consul General and other officers to deliver at public events.

### USAID/Jakarta

About USAID Jakarta: the lead U.S. government agency that works to end extreme global poverty and enable resilient, democratic societies to realize their potential.

What Interns do in USAID Jakarta: help to promote U.S. development programs in Indonesia through radio, TV, newspaper, social media, events, public relations campaigns, research and develop public information.


